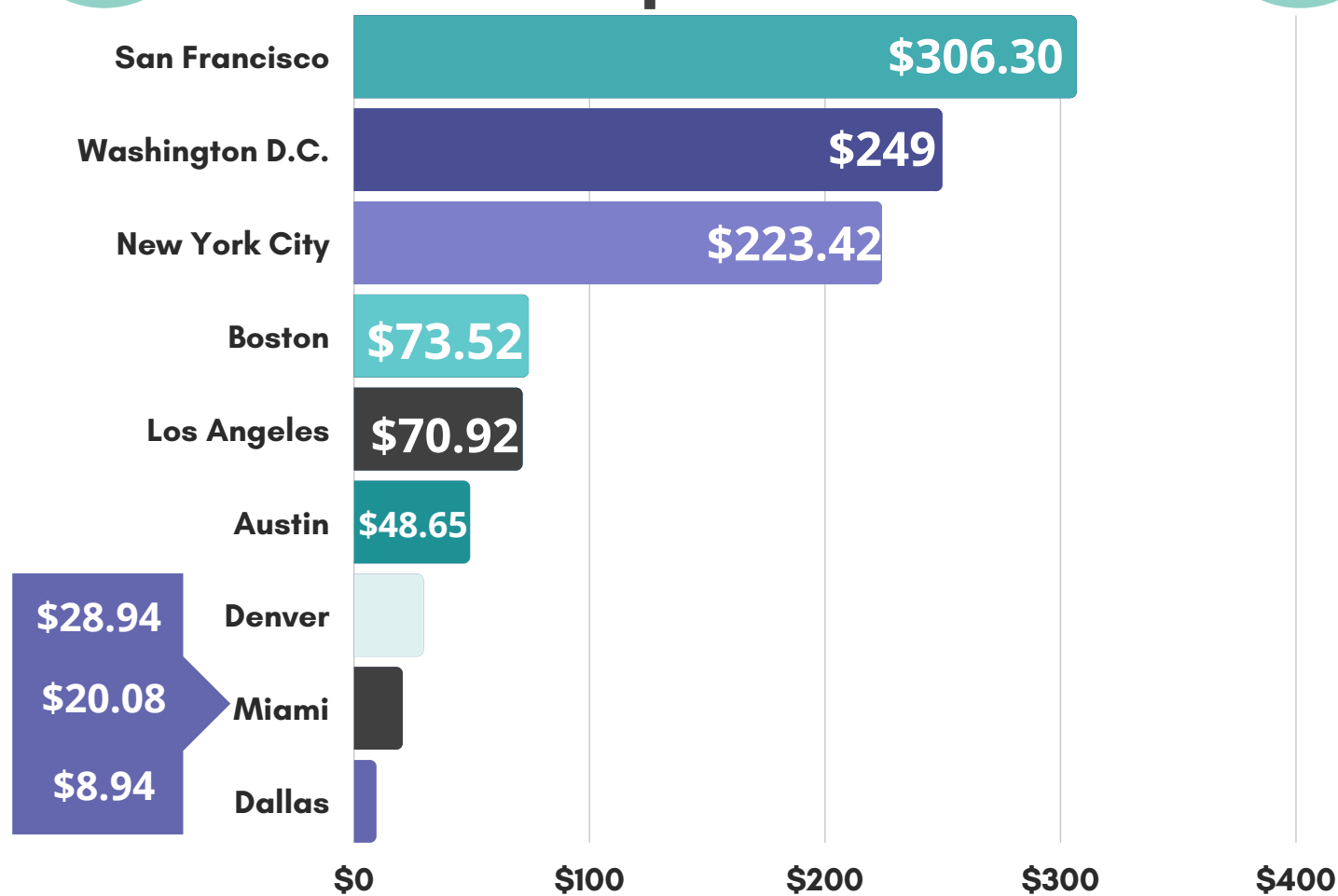
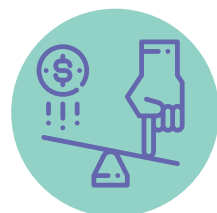


How Does Affordable Housing Spending in Los Angeles Compare to Other Major Cities?

The data presented below quantifies commitments to affordable housing across the United States. We've identified how much is spent in dollars on affordable housing projects in a selection of large cities/counties across the United States.



Los Angeles is Outspent on a Per Capita Basis

How Can Los Angeles Generate More Local Funding for Affordable Housing?

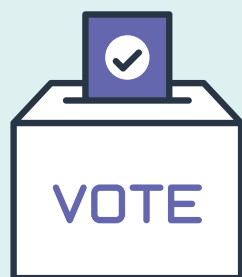


Yes on ULA
